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Organizational Description

The Medical Center at Franklin, Inc., proudly serves the residents of Southern Kentucky and Northern Tennessee with the services that allow them to remain close to home for medical care. The hospital's roots reach back to the Franklin-Simpson Memorial Hospital (Hospital) which opened in December 1968. In 2000, Commonwealth Health Corporation (Corporation) established The Medical Center at Franklin, Inc., as a non-stock, nonprofit Kentucky corporation to acquire the Hospital.

The Medical Center at Franklin, Inc. has been determined by the Internal Revenue Service (the "IRS") to be a charitable organization as described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") and is exempt from federal income taxation by virtue of Sections 501(a) and 501(c)(3) of the Code.

The Medical Center at Franklin, Inc. is owned and controlled by Commonwealth Health Corporation, Inc., a non-stock, nonprofit Kentucky corporation ("CHC"), under a holding company arrangement, which was established in 1984. CHC has been determined by the IRS to be a charitable organization as described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code") and is exempt from federal income taxation by virtue of Sections 501(a) and 501(c)(3) of the Code.

Since 2000, major facility additions, interior renovations and site development to and within the existing hospital facility have been made. They include (1) construction of a replacement 25 bed inpatient care unit, to include private rooms with private baths, isolation rooms, a nurse's station, clean and soiled utility rooms and other improvements to meet safety and accessibility requirements; (2) renovation of public and common areas, modernization of the food services department to meet safety requirements and upgrades of the imaging areas, including the MRI Suite; and (3) upgrading and modernization of the physical plant, including a new chiller system, new air handlers, electrical service upgrade and replacement of the emergency generator and fire alarm systems. In addition, a separate office building has been constructed to provide office space for specialty clinics and physician services. Also, additional building space has been constructed to house certain ancillary services and to provide physician office space.

The Medical Center at Franklin is a Joint Commission Accredited, 25 bed dual licensed critical access hospital. The hospital's Emergency Department is staffed with physicians and registered nurses 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. We have CT, MRI, Digital Mammography, Ultrasound, and Nuclear Medicine available at the facility. Radiologists are available to read in real time via PACs or on-site. The Laboratory and Respiratory Therapy Departments are staffed daily 24 hours per day. Our facility also provides physical rehabilitation services, including Physical Therapy, Speech Therapy, and Occupational Therapy.

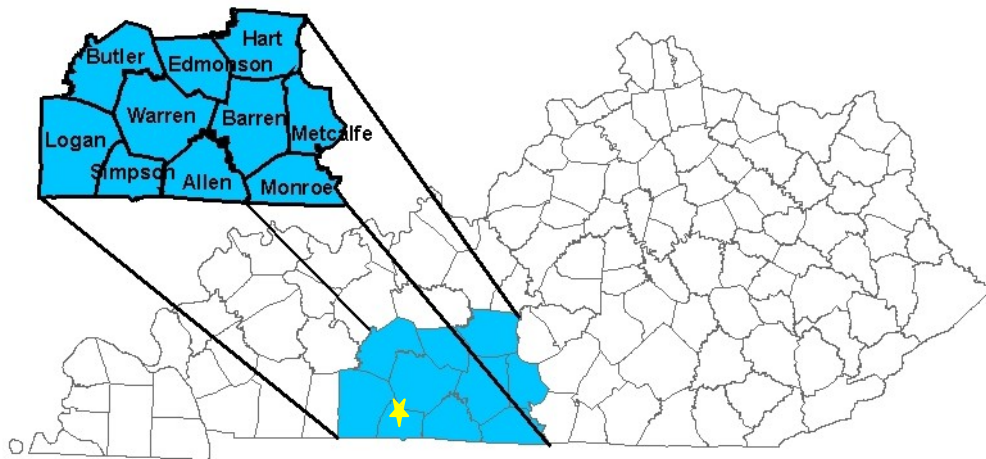
We have a surgery department with two operating suites, one endoscopy suite and a six bed PACU. Services include general surgery, cataract surgery and refractive surgery.

Currently we have 5 full-time primary care physicians who have private practices in Franklin. We also have a fulltime surgeon and a part-time surgeon who practice at our hospital. There are several specialists who hold clinics on campus to accommodate the local residents. Those specialists include: Urology, Psychiatry, Obstetrics, Orthopedics, Cardiologist, Pulmonologist, Nephrology, and Podiatrist.

Service Area Description

The Medical Center at Franklin is located in Southcentral Kentucky off Interstate 65, between exits 2 and 6, 2 miles north of the Tennessee state line. Our hospital provides inpatient and outpatient services for residents in Franklin and Simpson County, Kentucky which makes up approximately 84.8% of our discharges. Other patient origins come from Warren County, Kentucky, 6.0%; Logan County, Kentucky 4.9%; Allen County, Kentucky 2.6%. The other Kentucky counties identified are: Barren, Butler, Pike, Todd, Edmonson, Metcalfe and Monroe. These counties account for 0.1% - 0.4% of discharges. In 2011 The Medical Center at Franklin had 61 out of state discharges. Of the 61, Tennessee accounted for 91.8%; Florida 3.3%; Illinois, Indiana and Michigan each at 1.6% of the out of state discharges.

Community Definition and Description

The City of Franklin is a prosperous community located in Simpson County, Kentucky. Access to a major interstate (I-65) is a big plus for our businesses. The community has been able to maintain a low cost of living while keeping a high quality of life in a “small town America” setting. This progressive small community has been honored as one of the 50 Best Small Southern Towns and placed on this exclusive list. Franklin is in close proximity to Bowling Green, Kentucky, and Nashville, Tennessee, which allows for big city amenities nearby. We have state-of-the-art healthcare, arts and culture, recreation opportunities for youth and adults. In addition, an excellent local school system, technical school, nearby universities, colleges and other institutions provide opportunities for higher education. Franklin is the hub for the county consisting of approximately 17,826 individuals in 2014.

The population estimate 2011 provided by the U.S. Department of Commerce is 17,378 for Simpson County. There were 6,415 households out of which 33.80% had children under the age of 18 living with them, 56.80% were married couples living together, 11.50% had a female householder with no husband present, and 27.70% were non-families. 24.20% of all households were made up of individuals and 10.40% had someone living alone who was 65 years of age or older. The average household size was 2.52 and the average family size was 2.97.

The age distribution was 26.20% under the age of 18, 8.50% from 18 to 24, 29.20% from 25 to 44, 23.00% from 45 to 64, and 13.10% who were 65 years of age or older. The median age was 36 years. For every 100 females there were 95.30 males. For every 100 females age 18 and over, there were 91.60 males.

The median income for a household in the county was \$36,432, and the median income for a family was \$42,525. Males had a median income of \$32,160 versus \$22,667 for females. The per capita income for the county was \$17,150. About 8.50% of families and 11.60% of the population were below the poverty line, including 14.00% of those under age 18 and 15.90% of those, age 65 or over.

According to the U.S. Bureau of the Census, Population Estimates Program (PEP), the population estimate for 2013 in Simpson County was 17,728 and 17,826 in 2014. During 2013, the age distribution consisted of 24.7% under the age of 18 and 15.4% over the age of 65. Overall, the average household units in 2014 was estimated at 7,577, with the average number of persons per household averaging at 2.54. In the future, it is estimated that Kentucky's population including individuals over the age of 65 will increase approximately 68% (Kentucky Hospital Association, 2015).

In 2009-2013, the median income per household in the county was \$39,546. The per capita money income in 2013 dollars was \$19,441. Persons below poverty level during 2009-2013 estimated at 20.3% in Simpson County.

Purpose

The Community Needs Assessment has been completed for the following reasons:

- To help meet the hospital's mission to care for people and improved the quality of life in the communities we serve.
- To comply with the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010 and maintain the hospital's tax exempt status.
- To establish community health needs for the hospital's service area, to determine areas of greatest need and for the hospital to develop a strategic plan to address those needs.
- To involve internal and external resources to ensure needs of individuals are met and that efforts are not duplicated.
- To create a sustainable process for conducting Community Health Needs Assessment that can be continued for future assessments.

Executive Summary

The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act of 2010 include a provision that requires every tax exempt, non-governmental hospital to:

- Conduct a Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) at least every three years;
- Adopt a Strategic Implementation Plan that includes how the needs identified in the assessment will be met;
- Report to the Internal Revenue Service via its 990 tax form how it is meeting its implementation plan.

The Community Health Needs Assessment Report details the process used to collect, disseminate, and prioritize the information in the assessment. The Medical Center at Franklin worked closely with local healthcare and public health leaders throughout the assessment process.

The end result of the assessment process was the development by the hospital of a strategic plan to address the major needs identified.

Process

In September of 2011, The Medical Center at Franklin joined with the Barren River District Health Department and numerous other health care providers, community organizations and leaders to form the Barren River Community Health Planning Council. During the fall and winter of 2014-15, the council was renamed the Barren River Initiative to Get Healthy Together (BRIGHT) Coalition. The goal of the Council was to plan and implement a community health needs survey and assessment process followed by identification of key health care needs for the community and then development of strategic plans to meet those needs. The process used was primarily based on the Mobilizing for Action Through Planning and Partnership (MAPP). Meetings were initially held twice monthly for three months and then once a month to every other month thereafter.

The hospital used the data collected through the survey to develop a strategic plan that addresses strengthening of partnerships with community health providers and organizations, preventive care and disease management and access to care,

The assessment results and strategic plan were submitted to the hospital board for review and approval and then make available to the community.

In January 2015, the BRIGHT Coalition conducted Community Survey #2. The survey was submitted to the Barren River Area Development District (BRADD) with a goal of each county having a 10% response rate. See survey tool below.

2. Preventative Care & Disease Management Focus

The 2012 Community Health Needs Assessment provided Simpson County data specific to preventative care and disease management. The data determined our top 4 focus areas:

(1) Cardiovascular Disease, (2) Other, (3) Obesity and (4) Access to Care. The hospital's plan was to address these as follows with the overall goal being to educate individuals on the importance of taking ownership of their health and wellbeing:

Cardiovascular:

- Provide education to community on risk factors associated with heart disease and stroke and how to modify those risk factors through healthy lifestyle choices. This will be an ongoing campaign through all media outlets,

newsletters, at Health & Wellness Center, through Worksite Wellness for employer groups, civic organizations, etc.

- A systematic approach will be implemented by the hospital to identify and track all congestive heart failure patients who are admitted. Discharge planning will start at admission and will involve coaching and follow up services post discharge. The goal will be for improved quality of life for the patient and reduction of ED visits and readmissions.

Other:

- The Medical Center at Franklin will research the feasibility of starting a Health and Wellness Center on the Campus of the hospital.
- Offer frequent screening open to the community.
- Provide education on healthy lifestyle choices.
- Educational classes to include Cooper-Clayton Smoking Cessation, Weight Management and Exercise.
- Work in collaboration with community leaders and identify areas for indoor exercise programs.

Obesity:

- Increase awareness and utilization of The Medical Center at Franklin's outpatient Medical Nutrition Counseling services located at the Health & Wellness Center.
- Offer Healthy Weight/Healthy Life Classes at the Health & Wellness Center twice a year. Also make this available onsite for Employer Groups.
- Provide Healthy Eating presentations by registered dietitian to school groups, civic organizations, employer groups, etc.
- Work with Community Partners to secure grant funding for additional walking and fitness trails in community.
- Research grant funding in conjunction with community leaders to construct an indoor pool along with a therapy pool.

3. Access to Care

- Open a Rural Health Clinic on campus to provide another level of care for the community.

Discharge planning will start at admission and will involve coaching and follow-up services with the goal to improve quality of life for the patient and reduction of ED visits and readmissions.

The Community Health Worker program was implemented by the Health Department in April, 2014. The program originally targeted patients with diabetes who were discharged from the hospitals under Commonwealth Health Corporation. With the patient’s consent, community health workers would perform home visits to check the health status of the patient, educate patients as needed, and make certain that they were following their hospital instructions and following up with physician appointments. In 2015, the program began to also follow up on patients with congestive heart failure.

Preventative Care & Disease Management: Other

The Medical Center at Franklin offered frequent screenings open to the community in 2013-2015.

Wellness calendars have been posted monthly that provided free classes and screenings for the community. Screenings during 2013-2015 have included the following: Hearing screenings; blood pressure & heart rate screenings; bone density screenings; diabetes screenings; a variety of musculoskeletal injury screenings; weight, BMI, body fat, waist circumference screenings; balance screenings; dysphagia screenings; and Dermascan skin screenings. In addition, The Medical Center at Franklin began offering low-dose CT scans in 2014 that detects early stage lung cancer.

The Medical Center at Franklin provided education and classes on healthy lifestyle choices. Some of these events for coordinated with other community organizations.

Cooper-Clayton smoking cessation classes were offered to employers within the community during April-June, 2014 and July-September, 2014. Other calendar events that occurred during 2013-2015 included the following: Walk to Wellness; Alzheimer’s Support Group; Cancer Support Group; CHF Support Group; providing information on colon cancer awareness; beginners aerobic classes; yoga classes; senior fitness classes; COPD education classes; Stop Smoking Support Group; and Diabetes Support Groups. In addition, The Medical Center at Franklin coordinated a “Distracted Driving Program” at Franklin Simpson High School in March, 2014.

Preventative Care & Disease Management: Drug and Alcohol Abuse & Addiction

The Medical Center at Franklin has collaborated with the local Youth Action Group to provide free ten panel drug testing kits for parents who want to test their children. Educational materials, including appropriate available community resources, are provided with the drug kits. This initiative was implemented during the 4th quarter of 2015. In addition, The Medical Center at Franklin provided trick or treat anti-drug bags to school aged children in 2014 and 2015. Other education materials and community outreach events were performed through the organization’s Health & Wellness Center. Activities included the following:

The results will also be incorporated into the hospital's annual IRS tax form 990 submission.

The Medical Center at Franklin has been totally committed to the Community Health Needs Assessment throughout the process. It has served already to strengthen relationships with other providers of healthcare and organizations in the community. The survey conducted lead to data driven identification of key community health needs. The hospital has developed a detailed strategic plan to address these needs over the next three years with the ultimate goal being to improve the quality of life of the individuals in the community we serve.
